FINALS

Top 10 Australians plus internationals to go through to A Finals in C1M, C1W, C2M, K1W, K1M.

- Finals will be run in K1M and K1W categories. next 12 paddlers
- Final will consist of then extra 6 ranked paddlers in other classes after the A Final draw.

TEAMS

Team Events will be one run only and must be State / School based teams.

Team Age Categories: Sub Junior (14 & under), Junior (18 & under).

Each State may enter as many teams as they like, provided all paddlers compete for the same State.

Individual athletes may join together to form an independent team but the Organising Committee must approve the team's constitution. No composite State teams will be recognized.

Paddlers may NOT enter the same class in different age or gender categories (e.g. Paddlers may not enter two K1M events or two C2W events or one K1M event and a K1W event).

This Program for the 2019 Canoe Slalom Junior and Masters National Championships is subject to change at the Competition Organiser's discretion and in consultation with the Chief Judge. All competitors and officials should consult the Official Programme posted in the Compiling area at the race venue each day of the Event. Any changes made will be announced at the Briefing. Last minute changes will be broadcast during the course of the day.
